

A WORD FROM THE CHAIR



Our third annual meeting in Lisbon was a success marked by the intervention and cooperation of EU Commission and Council of Europe representatives, as well as the display of our now impressive exhibition; a wonderful walking tour around women's migration in Lisbon; and more discussions and good times between WEMov participants. Above all, this annual meeting was dedicated to our Ukrainian colleagues, Igor Lyman and Victoria Konstantinova, who managed to join us with support letters and invitation that allowed them to cross the Ukrainian border for a short visit in Portugal. This was the highlight of our meeting, and it underlined the importance of solidarity and mutual support in our network. Beyond research and deliverables, we are also engaged in a human experience of international cooperation and friendship, which is the strength of our network.

Among our achievements, my congratulations go to WG1 for gathering over 500 primary sources references and displaying over 120 on the online map; to WG2 for totaling over 1000 landmarks soon all on our map; to WG3 for advancing towards displaying datasets and the MOOC; to WG4 for their first capsules of women migrants' interviews on the map; to all participants for their active contributions which have led to the creation of a beautiful timeline of women's migration across Europe and a collection of letters and diaries, co-publications are on their way and exciting collaborations ahead.
