A lot has happened since our last newsletter, and I'm happy to announce that GP4 is starting with WEMov's selection to apply for the CIG grants! This is an honour and recognition of our success and good practices.

Indeed, GP3 ended with additional funding which allowed all WGs to meet in-person as well as an outstanding transcribathon to be held in Georgia, and these additional meetings have greatly increased our deliverables: WG1 has reached over 900 primary sources references in its register, WG2 now has over 1200 landmarks lined up, WG3 will soon release its catalogue of datasets and WG4 is covering all COST countries with its map of interviews. Additionally, co-publications are on their way in each WG and this is really exciting!

WG4's project to shoot a documentary is advancing well with the first shootings held in the Grant Holder's town, and I can't wait to share it with you during our August meeting in Amiens, France. In the meantime, we will also meet in Brussels for our EU Parliament exhibition and roundtable, another recognition of our visibility and hard work!



GP4 also started with new leaders, and I would like to warmly thank former leaders and welcome the new team which is going to lead us to the end of this adventure.

Indeed, GP4 marks the end of our project funded by COST, but not the end of our collaboration as we're moving towards a sustainable network with exciting projects and cooperation ahead.

Indeed, our new sustainable website is being launched along with our catalogues for all projects. We can also be proud to have gathered 1500 registered learners in our MOOC. Our mission to make women's migration visible is clearly well advanced, as women migrants deserve to be acknowledged and heard. Looking forward for more, so stay tuned!
